Swimming and water safety

Swimming lessons at Chaucer take place throughout the year and in 2018-19, Year 4 swam from September to July. We also provided booster swimming sessions for Year 5 pupils, from April to July, for those who had not achieved the national requirement of swimming 25m, using a range of strokes and knowing safe rescue.
