





## Big, wide world

This topic teaches children about the global community to which they belong and explores how living things, communities and climates differ around the world.



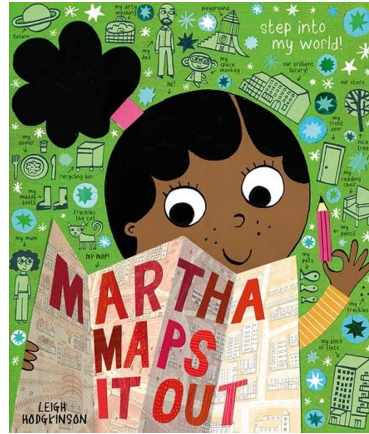
